Through simple acts of kindness, the "**POWER OF ONE**" is still transforming hearts and helping NCM meet its growing needs.

In August, **ONE** committed church (Perimeter Church), generously donated book bags filled with brand new school supplies. Because of the love of **ONE** woman, Nancy Burdett from Bethel Baptist, each book bag contained a personalized handwritten note card that offered encouragement and hope to each child. Additionally, **ONE** group of men from One Heart Church gave time in September to assist in a project to expand NCM's client intake area.

Also, during the first weekend in October, **ONE** unified group of local churches, schools and neighborhoods came together through "Compassion in Action" to lay new flooring in the lobby, paint fresh lines in the parking lot, trim shrubs and landscape the grounds, and host over 20 drives that helped to fill NCM's food pantry shelves.

Transformational Case Management - One Family at a Time

Those of you familiar with NCM's client services will know about its food pantry, clothing closet and limited financial assistance to local Norcross residents. But you might not know about a behind the scenes program that is quietly helping our clients move from crisis to stability through ongoing case management. This is where Nicole Cornish, Case Manager at NCM, has been making a difference — one family at a time.



For over a year, Nicole has been providing intensive case management to families at imminent risk of eviction through the Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP). This federal program was developed as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 and is administered at the local level by Gwinnett County Government.

With the assistance of these funds, NCM has helped over 30 households through individualized case management plans designed to help them find gainful employment, reduce household expenses, and set their own personal goals to help them move toward financial stability.

Clients are also given referrals to partnering agencies and community resources that address specific needs unique to individual families.

"Initially, I had a challenging time finding an internship," Nicole says. "Other agencies kept pointing me in NCM's direction. I met with Ms. Shirley and she took a chance on me and later added me to her staff. I am very grateful to her and the Lord for this opportunity to serve, and I know I am right where God wants me."

"I really enjoy encouraging people," she adds. "So many clients feel disconnected from their families and don't have support systems. Our goal is to get them connected, and provide resources to help them make positive choices for themselves and their families."

One-on-One Transformation through Life Coaching and Discipleship

In line with its mission to "transform lives through the love of Christ," NCM has a new program offering programs and services life coaching and one-on-one discipleship.

Driven by the desire to see clients move from crisis to stability, Dr. Warren Jones, a certified life coach, retired minister and NCM Intake Volunteer, is currently offering life coaching and discipleship sessions.

"Serving in intake has allowed me to interact personally with our clients," says Warren. "I see a real need to help people find their God-given passion. Coaching offers a practical way to engage people in living lives that really work. Instead of a mindset that is focused on what "I" want, the goal is to help them move to one of what "God and I" want. It's a partnership that is only successful

when they understand that God uniquely created them with a purpose in life."

When asked if he had any thoughts to share with other pastors, Warren stated, "I believe what I am doing is part of the Great Commission. I have found that many times the only interaction individuals have with their pastors is in the pulpit. NCM offers clergy the chance to personally talk to people in their valley and empower them to live life with both feet planted in heaven and on earth. Because people have an opportunity here to be transparent and share frustrations, sometimes they are more open to hearing the gospel presented. I encourage all ministers of the "Good News" to get involved in what God is doing at NCM. 'The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few.'

Recap of Recent NCM Events

June: Vacation Bible School

Every summer, churches provide VBS for the children of clients being served. Thank you to the following churches for helping this year: 1) Peachtree Corners Christian Church. 2) Johns Creek United Methodist, 3) Peachtree Corners Presbyterian, and 4) Norcross First Baptist.



July: Career Fest 2010 NCM hosted its annual job fair, now in its 10th year. In partnership with the GA Department of Labor (DOL) and Norcross First United Methodist, the event attracted over 500 job seekers who attended workshops on resume writing, effective interviewing, and networking. Hiring companies met with attendees, and agencies shared community resources. One week prior to the event, NCM held a career coaching day to help clients with their resumes and to practice interviewing techniques. They also were given business attire to wear to the event. Over 30 clients attended.

August: Back to School

In August of each year, NCM distributes book bags filled with school supplies to Norcross children in need. This year. thanks to the generosity of our community, NCM provided over 950 bags to help children start the school off right. NCM wants to extend a special thanks to Perimeter Church. Infiniti of Gwinnett and our community of churches and caring individuals.

October: Norcross Arts Fest

NCM had a booth at the Arts Festival in downtown Norcross. Over 40,000 people attended the event, allowing NCM to gain great exposure in the community.

City of Norcross Recycling Day

The City of Norcross also hosted a recycling day in early October, which included a food drive netting more than 23 boxes of food for NCM.



Kitchen: On October 7th, California Pizza Kitchen (located at the Forum) sponsored a fundraiser and 20% of the sales were donated to NCM. Thank you to the staff for making this happen, and to everyone in the community who came out to "Dine for NCM." Proceeds from the event were in excess of \$350.

Compassion In Action: Every vear. Unite churches come together on the first weekend in October for "Compassion in Action" weekend. During this time, they take part in various community projects. This vear, groups were responsible for hosting neighborhood food drives, putting down tile in the NCM lobby, painting fresh lines in the parking lot and landscaping the grounds. Groups also hosted a carnival for the kids that included food, games and other activities.

- HOMELESS BASKETS: As the holidays draw near and we make plans to spend time with our families -• eating Thanksgiving turkey and sharing Christmas gifts — we encourage you to think about those who are far from family and displaced from their homes. Many have secured temporary lodging, but lack the general comforts of home. You can help us by donating fully assembled family baskets filled with basic necessities, or making a contribution toward these baskets. Most commonly donated items are towels, laundry detergent, paper goods, eating/cooking utensils, Bibles, and children's games and activities. For a child without a stable living environment, having the simple pleasures of home can bring security and hope.
