CRITICAL NEEDS

NCM is experiencing a critical shortage in our food pantry. Due to the recent high demands, our pantry shelves are nearly empty.

NCM Statistics: Jan-Jun

Between January and June, NCM served record numbers of people (neighbors) through our many programs.

During this time, NCM served:

- 1,043 First Time Families
