Some of NCM's 2011 Activities

Annual Pastors' Breakfast:

On **March 16th**, over 45 people

from member and supporting churches attended NCM's annual pastors' breakfast. The 2011 theme was, "The Power of **ONE** More."

Attendees were given a recap of our 2010 achievements, and clients shared testimony about services received. In addition, Michael Frech, Homeless Liaison and Social Worker with Gwinnett County Schools, shared information about the homeless population in our community. We appreciate all who attended and who support the work of NCM everyday.

City of Norcross Recycling Day & Food Drive:

On **April 9th**, The City of Norcross held a recycling day and food drive. NCM received \$1,784 in cash donations. NOTE: NCM is not able to accept furniture, mattresses, computer equipment, TVs, stereos, etc.



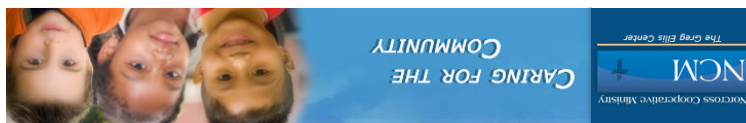
