### Read The Clay's Story...

Nicholas was injured on his construction job and soon found himself without work. As a result, in October 2013, the Clay family became homeless. They were directed to NCM for hotel assistance, basic food and clothing. The case manager overseeing their case noticed their determination to move beyond their current situation. The family was approved to go into the TLP (Transform Lives Program), which is a program to help families move from crisis to long term stability. The Clay family became connected with Generations Church (which is a supporting church of NCM) and began to make spiritual connections. The kids are now stable and doing well in school. Nicholas is hopeful of getting back to work real soon.



### Health Advocacy Program

NCM is excited to be the recipient of a grant from the Georgia Baptist Healthcare Foundation that will contribute to the funding of our new Health Advocacy Program. Through collaboration with Gwinnett Medical Center we now have a Faith Community Nurse (Donna Galucki) working with the clients assisting with medical issues. It is our goal that this new initiative will complement what we are already doing to **transform** the lives of our clients.
