How it all began...

In October 1986, the seed was planted with church leaders considering "wouldn't it be wonderful if all the Norcross area churches could combine their efforts to help those in need in our area?"

Then it happened. In 1988 several local churches joined together to form the Norcross Cooperative Ministry with a mission to provide services to low income and homeless families in our community. In the beginning NCM provided food for 2 to 5 families a day. NCM now serves 50 to 70 families a day with food, clothing, and financial assistance. Responding to the changing dynamics of the community, NCM continues to expand these critical services and adding news ones that include toiletries, small household items, baby items, spiritual guidance, medical referrals, personal empowerment classes, children's activities, school supplies and Christmas assistance.

More than 30 years serving our community, our mission states "Helping those in crisis by collaborating with the community to offer programs and services that transform lives through the love of Christ." It is through the support of our local churches, businesses, social and civic organizations, foundations, grants and individuals that make this ministry possible. Together we are making a difference in our community.

Curtis Brown Finding Family in an Unexpected Place





